ROLE OF CANCER REGISTRY


- 1) To obtain basic clinical and epidemiologic data
- 2) To describe incidence patterns
- 3) To monitor incidence and mortality trends
- 4) To support cancer research

A facility that collects, stores, analyses and interprets data on persons with cancer.

FACTORS FAVOURING REGISTRATION

1. Stable and compact population
2. Good infrastructure and communications
3. Available and accessible medical care
4. Comprehensive registration of deaths
5. Co-operation of healthcare professionals

REGISTER OF ALL CANCER CASES


FACTORS FOR SUCCESS

6. Protect confidentiality


Singapore Cancer Registry

1. Population-based registry which started operations on 1st January 1968.
2. Now administered by the National Registry of Diseases Office (MOH).
3. Made statutorily compulsory since 2007.
4. Facilitated by unique personal ID number.
5. Produced altogether 9 reports, with one more to be released 2016.
